

## **PUBLIC HEALTH LEAD**

### **The role**

- To strengthen the strategy of occupational medicine and public health working together;
- To develop a 2 year plan to be agreed by the Faculty & FPH, to progress this work, with clear goals and a plan of how to achieve them;
- To ensure every Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (in England) is reviewed by a specialist occupational physician, in conjunction with a public health specialist, and makes reference to the health of the working age population, by May 2017; and to set a comparable target relevant to Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
- To be a point of reference for all the representatives involved in the JSNA review (especially the current one);
- To report to the Faculty board quarterly;
- To liaise closely with FPH and the Faculty's CEO;
- To be accountable to the Registrar.
