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### Collaborations with Macmillan Cancer Support

The Faculty is working alongside Macmillan Cancer Support in what will hopefully be the first of many joint initiatives. To kick things off, we are inviting all those affiliated with the Faculty to take part in a very short survey. It aims to assess the needs of OH professionals with regard to the knowledge and information needed to best assist cancer patients in returning to work.

Almost 750,000 people of working age are living with cancer, with this number estimated to rise to 1.7 million people by 2030 due to earlier diagnosis, improved treatment and an ageing workforce. According to Macmillan's own research, 82% of people affected by cancer think it is important to continue to work, and the charity is acutely aware of the significant role OH services play in supporting workers in all fields. To this end, the purpose of the survey is to identify any information and assistance that OH professionals may require when supporting someone affected by cancer.

This survey is the first step in a consultation process that could see Macmillan and the Faculty improve learning aids for employers, OH professionals and cancer sufferers themselves, and we are excited to be a part of such an initiative. The survey is a fantastic way of broadcasting the professional views of those working at the forefront of OH, and we would deeply appreciate it if you could find just 5–10 minutes to fill it out.

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## NHS Education Scotland National Training Programme Director vacancy - deadline 9 Nov

The National Training Programme Director (TPD) for Occupational Medicine will be

responsible for managing specialty training programmes for doctors holding the following appointments: specialty registrar (StR); and locum appointments for training (LATs).

The National TPD should be a Consultant and is accountable to the Postgraduate Dean or appropriate Associate Dean. They may also combine the role with that of an educational and/or clinical supervisor.

The post is available until 31 July 2018 in the first instance.

NIJAC is currently inviting applications for the office of fee paid Adjudicator (Medical Member) of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Appeals Panel, Northern Ireland.

The purpose of the office is to hear and consider appeals against decisions about compensation made by Compensation Services Northern Ireland. To be eligible for appointment candidates must be a fully registered medical practitioner with the GMC. Remuneration will be provided on a per half day basis, paying £134.50 for a half day and £269.00 for a whole day.
