Accreditation for occupational health services - web site launched

The Faculty of Occupational Medicine is pleased to announce that the launch of the new SEQOHS accreditation scheme will take place on 1 December 2010 at the conference, *Promoting quality in occupational health – how can we do better?* See: http://www.facoccmed.ac.uk/library/docs/conffomdec10.pdf and that its supporting website http://www.seqohs.org has gone live. Here you will find information on how to register an interest in becoming accredited and in becoming an assessor.

The accreditation website is currently being piloted and will go live on 1 December 2010. The accreditation scheme will be fully operational thereafter and it is expected that the first services will be accredited in 2011.

The new web site will support both the self-assessment and full accreditation of occupational health services against SEQOHS standards. The site will also feature links to other resources that will help the occupational health services and practitioners in improving their services. Some of these resources will include a new knowledge management system that will underpin the standards and share good practice.
