The Wilf Howe Memorial Prize, which is a cheque for £500 and an engraved memento, is awarded in recognition of an outstanding innovation, initiative or intervention which has delivered a demonstrable health benefit for a defined working population. Previous winning entries have included: The assessment and validation of acclimatisation to a hot-dry climate in British Armed Forces personnel; Implementing and evaluating a successful condom promotion intervention project for brothel-based sex workers in Singapore; and Identifying and addressing occupational-related skin problems on a chemical industrial site.

**The Mobbs Travelling Fellowship** offers an opportunity for doctors to travel to a centre of excellence to study a particular aspect of occupational medicine or to travel to a scientific meeting for which they have had a paper or poster accepted. Previous winning entries have included: a visit to Australia to study the Workers' Compensation System; abstracts accepted for the ICOH conference; and a study trip to Hong Kong hospitals affected by the SARS outbreak.
